

Assessment Criteria for the GLOBUS Pooled Fund

The following is an overview over the five assessment criteria and sub-criteria which forms the basis of the assessment of the applications. The criteria are based on the criteria put forward in the fund guidelines. Criteria written in *italics* are only applicable for projects over DKK 200.000.

1. Purpose and	1.1 The purpose of the project aligns with the GLOBUS pooled fund
relevance	guidelines and main purpose which is to engage Danish students in the UN's
	development goals (SDGs) and international development cooperation.
	1.2 The SDG(s) which have been selected as relevant to the project make
	sense and are compatible, and it is described how the partners will work with
	these SDGs throughout the project.
2. The partners and	2.1 The main applicant and its Danish partners have the experience and the
the cooperation	capacity to implement and administer the project.
	2.2 The partner in the Global South has experience and organizational capacity of
	relevance to the project implementation and is a pertinent partner to the Danish
	partner(s) and the project.
3. Civic engagement activities	3.1 The target group size is proportional to the project and the composition
	of the target group meets the requirement of including Danish students.
	3.2 The civic engagement activities have the potential of engaging the target
	group in the development cooperation and the SDGs.
	3.3 There is an appropriate plan for and approach to documenting results on
	target group level regarding enhanced knowledge and competences of UN's
	development goals and international development cooperation because of the
	civic engagement activities.
4. Sustainability	4.1 The project's contribution to sustainable development in the Global South
	is proportional to the content and budget size of the project.
	4.2 <u>For Circular economy projects:</u>
	- Any shipment of used equipment meets the shipping requirements of the
	GLOBUS pooled fund.
	- The shipment matches a local need and context, and contributes to
	sustainable development in the Global South.
	- There is an appropriate plan for and approach to documenting the projects'
	contribution to sustainable development locally.
	4.3 <u>For educational exchange of students' projects:</u>
	- The Danish participants' professional competences/occupation is relevant
	to the project and will be used in the project.
	- The safety precautions for the Danish participants travelling abroad are
	sufficient and well prepared - in addition to a relevant insurance coverage.
